

Notes on today's services

When Amos reports his vision of God judging Israel for its mistreatment of the poor, he becomes a threat to the power of the priests and the king. John the Baptist also speaks truth to power, and Herod has him killed. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. We are called to witness to justice in company with them, and to proclaim God's saving love.

End 68 Hours of Hunger: Covid 19 has affected every aspect of normal life including 68 Hours of Hunger. Unlike previous years, our volunteers continued to pack food for the children of Portsmouth last summer. In order to keep everyone safe, we limited our volunteer group to a very small handful of people. A normal packing schedule resumed in September as schools started to reopen in modified ways. Throughout the 2020 2021 school year, demand for these extra meals was down from previous years. Still, our small volunteer group packed over 3400 meals for the children of Portsmouth. We are not going to pack food this summer. Thanks to vaccinations, fall 2021 will hopefully bring us back to a more normal life. We will be in touch with our Holy Trinity Family in September, recruiting more volunteers. We expect to be packing food on Thursdays once a month. The commitment is less than an hour. We welcome all to help with this very worthwhile volunteer opportunity! It is wonderful to be able to feed our local children in need.

A Memorial Service for Len Klein will be held on Thursday, July 22 at 2:00 PM. All are invited to attend the memorial service. A light reception will follow. There will be a signup sheet for refreshments at the Greeters Table.



Gospel

P: The holy gospel according to St. Mark, Chapter 6:14-29

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

¹⁴King Herod heard of [the disciples' preaching,] for Jesus' name had become known. Some were saying, "John the baptizer has been raised from the dead; and for this reason these powers are at work in him." ¹⁵But others said, "It is Elijah." And others said, "It is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." ¹⁶But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."


¹⁷For Herod himself had sent men who arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because Herod had married her. ¹⁸For John had been telling Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." ¹⁹And Herodias had a grudge against him, and wanted to kill him. But she could not, ²⁰for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he protected him. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed; and yet he liked to listen to him. ²¹But an opportunity came when Herod on his birthday gave a banquet for his courtiers and officers and for the leaders of Galilee. ²²When his daughter Herodias came in and danced, she pleased Herod and his guests; and the king said to the girl, "Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it." ²³And he solemnly swore to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, even half of my kingdom." ²⁴She went out and said to her mother, "What should I ask for?" She replied, "The head of John the baptizer." ²⁵Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, "I want you to give me at once the head of John the Baptist on a platter." ²⁶The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. ²⁷Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head. He went and beheaded him in the prison, ²⁸brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother. ²⁹When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

- C: Amen.


Rites of Passage and Announcements
