Could our prayers ever be heard as a threat to unjust powers that be? Bartimaeus won't give up or go away quietly, but repeats his call for help more loudly. Do we ask so boldly? And are our prayers an honest answer to Jesus' question, "What do you want me to do for you?"

Ascentria Care Alliance's Afghan Resettlement Effort is creating an innovative human-centered care model to help individuals and families in transition to move forward and thrive...physically, intellectually, socially, spiritually, and economically. Today after Worship, the adult forum will describe the formation of Neighborhood Support Teams (NSTs) to support Afghans as they arrive in New Hampshire. The presentation will describe ways Holy Trinity can get involved, where we can send donations, and how we can combine efforts with other congregations.
