³¹Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; ³²and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." ³³They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?"

³⁴Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. ³⁶So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."

Sermon

Affirmation of Baptism/Rite of Confirmation

- P: Dear friends, we give thanks for the gift of baptism and for Avani, one with us in the body of Christ, who are making public affirmation of their baptism.
- P: Let us pray.

Merciful God, we thank you for this sister, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

C: Amen.

Profession of Faith

- P: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.
- P: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you believe in God the Father?
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius

Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

- P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Affirmation in the Presence of the Assembly

P: You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism: To live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each Confirmand responds: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

- P: People of God, do you promise to support these *sisters and brothers* and pray for *them* in *their* life in Christ?
- C: We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.
- P: In preparation for this day, you have studied the Bible and the Christian faith for over two years, attending weekly classes, fulfilling homework assignments, writing sermon notes, serving in the life of the church and much more. In these last stages of preparation, you have chosen Bible verses


that are meaningful for your life. I now ask that you recite your Bible verse to the congregation.

Prayer and Laying on of Hands

- P: I now invite your parents forward to stand behind you and to place their hands upon your shoulder.
- P: Let us pray.
- P: We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.
- P: Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake,

stir up in (confirmand's first and last name) the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm his/her faith, guide his/her life, empower him/her in his/her serving, give him/her patience in suffering, and bring him/her to everlasting life. Amen.

- P: When you were baptized, the Pastor announced the promise that you are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. I now invite your parents to repeat that promise to you as they make the sign of the cross on your forehead and announce the words.
- <u>Parents</u>: You are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.
- C: We rejoice with you in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

Prayers of the People

P: We lift before you all those whose work puts them in harm's way for the sake of others, especially first responders and servicewomen and men who are stationed around the world. Allow all people to return home safely and keep them close to you. Hear us, O God.

C: Your mercy is great.

P: We pray for all who long for healing in mind, body, or spirit. Strengthen hospitals, clinics, counseling centers, nursing homes, and recovery centers to be holy spaces of renewal that all might live the abundant life you intend. We pray especially for those whose names we say out loud or silently. —A brief silence— Hear us, O God.

C: Your mercy is great.

P: We pray for our partners in mission and ministry: Presiding Bishop
 Elizabeth Eaton and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, Bishop
 James Hazelwood and the New England Synod, Pastor Livingstone

Msungu and the Isimani congregation in Tanzania, Fundaninos Orphanage in Guatemala, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and Imanuel Indonesian Lutheran Congregation, Ascentria Care Alliance and Camp Calumet. Hear us, O God.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
