Announcements

Happy Mother's Day: We wish all mothers a wonderful Happy Mother's Day. Thank you for your kindness, your love, your hard work, and your support. We hope your children and your family give you a much needed day of relaxation and chocolate.

Pop-Up Pantry: Last week the PUP committee met and decided we would be closing the pantry on May 11. Lots of reasons; reduced visitors, loss of free food supply, inability to fully fund and our belief that this was a temporary ministry. It was Pastor Tim's idea on how he felt our church could help those in need during the pandemic. With the help of food and monetary donations from you and food donations from Gather, we were able to be out there every Wednesday beginning on July 8, 2020! Since then, we have distributed 2,072 bags during 95 straight weeks! We became like the post office, neither rain nor sleet nor snow....! It is with the utmost gratitude that we say a resounding **Thank You for Being There for Us!**

Semi-Annual Meeting will be June 12.

Nametags: Holy Trinity has now provided permanent and reusable nametags for our congregational members. You can find yours in your mailbox. If you find you don't have one of these nametags, please speak to the Church Office. Alternatively, you can still find the adhesive nametags at the table next to the bulletins.

Holy Trinity's Update to our Congregational Constitution: Toward the end of 2021, we undertook a review and revision of our Constitution. At the end of November, a task force led by Russ Hilliard and Mark Beliveau completed revisions to the constitution reflecting changes that are required by the New England Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Additional changes to the proposed constitution reflect current ways in which we do business, such as allowing for electronic voting. The proposed constitution has been reviewed and approved by the Council, and will be reviewed and voted on by the congregation at the semi-annual meeting on June 12. Two documents are available for you to access and review prior to the meeting. One is a brief memo prepared by Russ briefly describing changes that you will find in the second document which is the proposed constitution. Paper copies are available in the church office. Please read the documents in preparation for discussion at the meeting.

Camp Calumet will have its annual fundraiser "Walk the Walk" again in the summer 2022. It will be the same event as 2021, where you will have to sign up at Calumet's webpage, donate \$25, and report your July & August miles to Holy Trinity's team captain (and Office Coordinator): Mark Donahue. He will in turn, combine all of our congregation's miles and report it to Camp Calumet. If you would like to join "Team Holy Trinity", please talk to Mark. 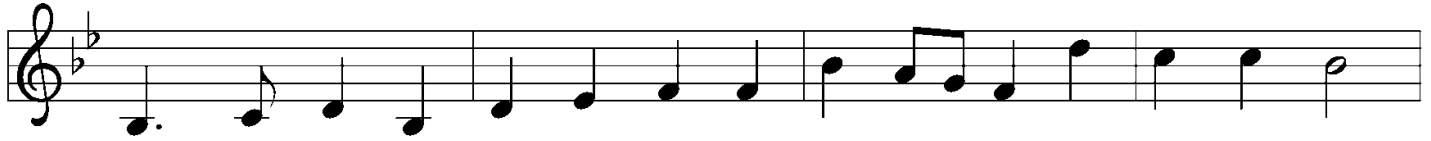

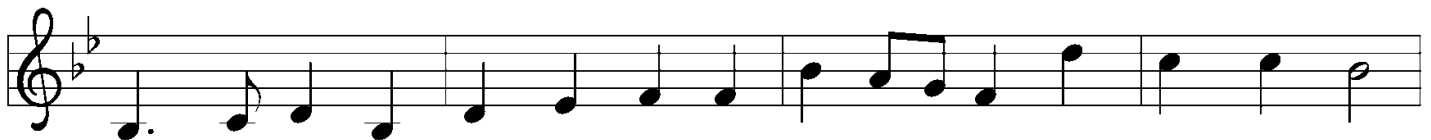

Pre-filled Communion Cups are still available for anyone uncomfortable coming forward to the altar. If you would like to receive communion from the Pastor, but you are unable to come forward, please ask someone to talk to the ushers and we will bring communion to you.

Thanksgiving at the Table

P: Blessed are you, O God of the universe. Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age.

Praise to you for creating the heavens and the earth. Praise to you for saving the earth from the waters of the flood. Praise to you for bringing the Israelites safely through the sea. Praise to you for leading your people through the wilderness to the land of milk and honey.

Praise to you for the words and deeds of Jesus, your anointed one. Praise to you for the death and resurrection of Christ. Praise to you for your Spirit poured out on all nations.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

With this bread and cup, we remember our Lord's Passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: O God of resurrection and new life: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence.

C: Come, Holy Spirit.

P: Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread. Raise us up as the body of Christ for the world. Breathe new life into us. Send us forth, burning with justice, peace, and love.

C: Come, Holy Spirit.

P: With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever.
