Thanks to the MSP team members - Mark Beliveau, Dot Kasik, Eileen Kackenmmeir, and Linda Edwards - for preparing the document based on the results of the work done by the Transition Team and all of you. The document is a summary of all the comments and discussions that we had between January and June. For those of you who remember the last MSP, please note that the Synod has adopted a new form that is quite different than the version in use a few years back. Please take time to pick up a paper copy in our Gathering Area today. Thanks for your continued prayers as we move to this next phase in our journey.

Church Office Closed Monday and Tuesday: Mark Donahue will be away from the office on Monday, August 29 and Tuesday, August 30. He will return to the office on Wednesday, August 31. (Mark will also be out of the Office on Monday, September 5 in observance of Labor Day.)

Welcome Back, Pastor Luther: We're pleased to announce that on Sunday, September 25, Pastor Luther Zeigler will be returning to Holy Trinity as our interim pastor. He will remain in this position through the end of the year when we will reevaluate our relationship depending on the status of the search for a permanent pastor. Pastor Luther will be with us on Sundays and Wednesdays, and potentially other times as situations arise. Please join us on September 25 to welcome Pastor Luther back into our midst.

Stewardship: Never Fear! It is going to happen and soon! The Time and Talent volunteer form will be coming out in mid-September. The Stewardship Committee and Ministry chairpersons hope that everyone who attends Holy Trinity will find an area where they can be of help to the congregation, the area, and the world. Each of us has a unique interest or expertise in something which will make a better place for all. When Pastor Luther begins his interim ministry, there will be many opportunities. Many of our world-wide ministries have faltered during the Pandemic, but now we are again able to come together to put ourselves into volunteering. We ask you consider where you interest lies and to use that interest in helping.

Tables of Eight: Here's how it works: you sign up, either as a single or a couple. You are then magically assigned to a group of approximately 8 people, some of whom you might know well, some you might have just made an acquaintance, some of whom you may never have seen before. Then during the next year your group will meet four times for a meal. Most traditionally the groups have met in each other's homes, where the host provides the main course and guests round out the meal with, e.g., appetizer, side, and dessert. But a group could meet at a restaurant or other place; the meal could be breakfast, brunch, or lunch; children could be included or not. However your group decides to do it—that's what you do. And groups have been very good at accommodating allergies and medical conditions so don't let that stop you. If you participated last year, you will automatically be assigned to a Tables group this year unless you let Jo or Mark know otherwise.





The Celebration of Holy Communion


As you come to the Lord's Table, know that it is Christ who invites you to receive the bread and wine, the body and blood. There will be a single communion station around the altar. You will receive a wafer (gluten free wafers are available). Next you may take a pre-filled glass of wine. Please put the glass in the basket by the baptismal font or the lectern. Pre-filled Communion Cups are still available for anyone uncomfortable coming forward to the altar. If you would like to receive communion from the Pastor, but you are unable to come forward, please ask someone to talk to the ushers and we will bring communion to you.

Thanksgiving at the Table

P: Blessed are you, O God of the universe. Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age.

Praise to you for creating the heavens and the earth. Praise to you for saving the earth from the waters of the flood. Praise to you for bringing the Israelites safely through the sea. Praise to you for leading your people through the wilderness to the land of milk and honey.

Praise to you for the words and deeds of Jesus, your anointed one. Praise to you for the death and resurrection of Christ.

Praise to you for your Spirit poured out on all nations.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

With this bread and cup, we remember our Lord's Passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: O God of resurrection and new life: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine. Bless this feast. Grace our table with your presence.

C: Come, Holy Spirit.

P: Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread. Raise us up as the body of Christ for the world. Breathe new life into us. Send us forth, burning with justice, peace, and love.

C: Come, Holy Spirit.

P: With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever.

C: Amen.
