NOTES ON TODAY'S SERVICE

Our re-creation in baptism is an image of the Genesis creation, where the Spirit of God moved over the waters. Both Mark's gospel and the story in Acts make clear that it is the Spirit's movement that distinguishes Jesus' baptism from John's. The Spirit has come upon us as upon Jesus and the Ephesians, calling us God's beloved children and setting us on Jesus' mission to recreate the world in the image of God's vision of justice and peace.

Today, we celebrate the "Feast of the Baptism of our Lord". This year our gospel text for this day comes from the evangelist Mark, who begins his gospel, not with the nativity scene, but rather with an account of Jesus being baptized in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. With great drama, Mark tells us that, as Jesus was coming up out of the water, "he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'" Mark 1:10-11.

We are a church whose life is centered in this Beloved Son of God, Jesus Christ. And just as Jesus was baptized, we are too. And, as we emerge from the baptismal waters, we are empowered and invited by the Holy Spirit to share in Christ's life and in his transforming work to heal our broken world. Our baptism is thus not a "one and done" event, but rather sets us out on a lifelong journey with Christ and His Church. Living our baptismal covenant means growing in our faith together and supporting one another in practices of discipleship.

For centuries, the Church has set aside this particular "feast day" for baptisms, confirmations, and for welcoming new members to the Church. And so, this Sunday we are overjoyed to baptize VJ Strehl, to confirm Adrianna Grace Marcus, and to welcome sixteen new members to the congregation, whose names are listed below.

Let us praise God for the gift of each of these brothers and sisters in Christ and offer thanks for this great sign of vitality and new life in our Church!

Rite of Baptism, Confirmation and Welcoming of New Members

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

The candidates for baptism, confirmation, and affirmation of baptismal vows and membership in the church will now be presented.

The Presentation of the Candidates

Craig Strehl: I present VJ Strehl for baptism.

Scott and Rani Marcus: We present Adrianna Grace Marcus for confirmation.

Judy Evans: I present the following persons to make an affirmation of their baptismal vows and to become members of the congregation: Chris Dunn, Linnea Richardson, Rani Marcus, Scott Marcus, April Murphy, Lena Olsson, Kem Taylor, Eileen Kackenmeister, Carl Kackenmeister, VJ Strehl, Craig Strehl, Meredith Goodwin, Pamela Brouker, and Julie Anderson.

The Examination of the Candidates

Pastor addresses each candidate:

- P: VJ, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized into Christ?
- VJ: I do.
- P: Adrianna, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to affirm your baptismal promises?

Adrianna: I do.

Holy Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church

P: Candidates for membership in the church, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to affirm your baptismal promises and become members of this church?

New Members: We do.

P: I now ask all of the candidates and their sponsors whether they promise to keep the commitments of baptism, including:

To live among God's faithful people;

To hear the Word of God and share in the Lord's Supper;

To grow in faith and nurture a life of prayer;

To proclaim the good news of God in Christ in word and deed;

To serve all people, following the example of Jesus; and

To strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Candidates and Sponsors: We do and we ask God to help and guide us.

P: I now ask this congregation whether you promise to support these candidates and pray for them in their life in Christ?

Congregation: We do.

The Profession of Faith

The presiding minister addresses candidates. The assembly may join in the responses.

- P: I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.
- P: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?
- C: I renounce them.

- P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?
- C: I renounce them.
- P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?
- C: I renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the candidates and the assembly.

- P: Do you believe in God the Father?
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

- P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

The Thanksgiving at the Font

Children are invited to sit in front of the font. Water may be poured into the font before or during the thanksgiving. At the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

P: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

C: Amen.

The Baptism

- P: VJ Strehl, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.

P: Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the head of the newly baptized, the minister prays for each:

P: Sustain VJ with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

C: Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. Oil prepared for this purpose may be used. As the sign of the cross is made, the minister says:

P: VJ, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

C: Amen.

A lighted candle may be given to the newly baptized (to a sponsor of a young child) as a representative of the congregation says:

P: Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life.

The ministers and the baptismal group face the assembly. A representative of the congregation leads the assembly in the welcome.

- P: Let us welcome the newly baptized, VJ.
- C: We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

The Confirmation


Adrianna comes forward with her parents, the Pastor lays hands on her head, and says:

- P: Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in Adrianna the gift of the Holy Spirit; confirm her faith, guide her life, empower her in serving, give her patience in suffering, and bring her to everlasting life.
- C: Amen.
- P: Let us rejoice with Adrianna in her life in Christ.
- C: We rejoice with you, Adrianna, in the life of baptism. Together we will give thanks and praise to God and proclaim the good news to all the world.

The Welcoming of New Members

The new members stand, having reaffirmed their baptismal vows, and the congregation welcomes them with this prayer:

- C: Almighty God, by the love of Jesus Christ you draw people to yourself and welcome them into the household of faith. May we show your joy by embracing new brothers and sisters as we bear your creative and redeeming word to all the world. Keep us close together in your Spirit, in the breaking of bread and the prayers, and in service to others, following the example of Jesus Christ, our servant and Lord. Amen.
- P: Let us welcome the newly baptized, the newly confirmed, and our new church members by singing together....





The Celebration of Holy Communion

As you come to the Lord's Table, know that it is Christ who invites you to receive the bread and wine, the body and blood. There will be a single communion station around the altar. You will receive a wafer (gluten free wafers are available). Next you may take a pre-filled glass of wine. Please put the glass in the basket by the baptismal font or the lectern. Pre-filled Communion Cups are still available for anyone uncomfortable coming forward to the altar. If you would like to receive communion from the Pastor, but you are unable to come forward, please ask someone to talk to the ushers and we will bring communion to you.

Preface

P: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ. By the leading of a star he was shown forth to all nations; in the waters of the Jordan you proclaimed him your beloved Son, and in the miracle of water turned to wine he revealed your glory. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, Holy, Holy Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty! Heav'n and earth are full of Your glory and Your grace. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who Comes in the name of the Lord God most high.

The Great Thanksgiving

P: You are indeed holy, almighty and merciful God. You are most holy, and great is the majesty of your glory. You so loved the world that you gave your only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but have eternal life.

We give you thanks for his coming into the world to fulfill for us your holy will and to accomplish all things for our salvation.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: Remembering, therefore, his salutary command, his life-giving passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension, and the promise of his coming again, we give thanks to you, O Lord God Almighty, not as we ought but as we are able; we ask you mercifully to accept our praise and thanksgiving and with your Word and Holy Spirit to bless us, your servants, and these your own gifts of bread and wine, so that we and all who share in the body and blood of Christ may be filled with heavenly blessing and grace, and, receiving the forgiveness of sin, may be formed to live as your holy people and be given our inheritance with all your saints. To you, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in your holy church, now and forever.

C: Amen.

Lord's Prayer

- Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us;
